## Using your CustomMaps Trip Plan from Better World Club

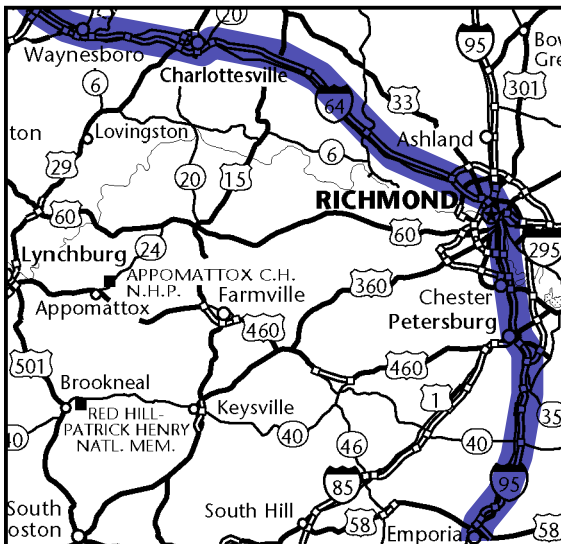

### California

#### Benicia

##### Benicia Capitol State Historic Park

*1st and W. G Sts.* The town served as the state capital during the gold-rush years of 1853-84. 707-745-3385

#### Dunsmuir

##### Castle Crags State Park

*South, off I-5.* Dramatic granite spires rise 4,000 feet above the Sacramento River canyon in this park. 530-235-2684

#### Red Bluff

##### William B. Ide Adobe State Historic Park

*Adobe Rd. N.E.* Original 1850 homestead and memorial to the only president of the short-lived California Republic. Visitor center open weekends. 530-529-8599

#### Redding

##### Lake Shasta Caverns

*I-5 N.* Included is a boat ride across Shasta Lake and a guided tour of the illuminated caves. 530-238-2341

##### Shasta Dam

*I-5 W.* Built between 1938 and 1945, Shasta Dam is second in size in the country only to the Grand Coulee. 530-275-4463

##### Shasta State Historic Park

*Calif. 299 W.* Remains of an 1860s gold-rush town, strung along both sides of the highway, include several building ruins. Open Wed.-Sun. 530-243-8194

#### San Francisco

##### Alcatraz Island

*In San Francisco Bay.* This 12-acre rock outpost was converted from a military fort to an escape-proof federal penitentiary. 415-981-7625

##### Cable Car Museum

*1201 Mason St.* Exhibits chronicle the cable car system's construction and operation. 415-474-1887

##### Cable Cars/Transit Info

These charming, unique hill climbers, in their second century of service, clickety-clack over three lines. 415-673-6864

##### Cartoon Art Museum

*655 Mission St.* Museum displays the finest original cartoon art as well as cartooning classes and interactive educational programs. 415-227-8666

##### Chinatown

*Grant Ave., from Bush St. to Broadway.* Pagoda-style roofs dominate the distinctive architecture of the largest Chinese community outside Asia. Walking tours avail. 415-986-1822

##### Crocker Galleria

*50 Post St.* Sixty-two specialty shops and three restaurants on three levels are featured in an atrium setting. Closed Sun. 415-393-1505

##### Exploratorium

*3601 Lyon St.* This acclaimed science museum, founded by Dr. Frank Oppenheimer in 1979, has more than 650 hands-on exhibits. 415-397-5673

##### Fisherman's Wharf

*Bayside.* The city's fishing fleet, ferries and excursion boats are based here. The wharf is ringed by restaurants and souvenir shops.

##### Ghirardelli Square

*Beach and Larkin Sts.* The site of the old Ghirardelli chocolate factory is now filled with restaurants, shops, bakeries, and a theater. 415-775-5500

##### Golden Gate Bridge

*Spanning San Francisco Bay.* "The bridge that couldn't be built" is to many the most beautiful bridge in the world. 415-921-5858

##### Golden Gate National Recreation Area

*Entrance at Bay and Franklin Sts.* Maps and information on all the park's facilities are available at GGNRA Headquarters, Upper Fort Mason, Bldg. 201. 415-561-4700

##### Golden Gate Park

*W. side of the city.* Some of the most outstanding attractions found within this 1,017 acre park are natural history and art museums; along with botanical and Japanese gardens. 415-561-4700

##### Lombard St.

*Begins on Hyde St.* The "Crookedest Street in the World" descends in a serpentine pattern of flower-filled hairpin curves.

##### Magic Theatre

*Fort Mason Center.* The theatre allows emerging and established playwrights engage audiences in a unique experience. 415-441-8822

##### Marin Headlands

*Field Rd.* Scenic recreation area offers beautiful beaches, hills, valleys and wonderful vistas of the Golden Gate Bridge. 415-331-1540

##### Muir Woods National Monument

*12 mi. N., Calif. 1.* A splendid stand of virgin redwoods is preserved in this 550-acre park. 415-388-2595

##### Pier 39

*E. of Fisherman's Wharf.* This restaurant and shopping complex resembles turn-of-the-century San Francisco. 415-705-5500

##### Presidio of San Francisco

*At the south end of the Golden Gate Bridge.* The Presidio of San Francisco is a federal military reservation of more than 1,400 wooded acres. 415-561-4323

##### San Francisco Zoo

*1 Zoo Rd.* More than 1,000 exotic animals can be viewed in this 70-acre garden park. 415-753-7080

##### Six Flags Discovery Kingdom

*I-80 and Calif. 37., Vallejo.* Only combination wildlife park, oceanarium, theme park in the country. Attractions showcase animals of land, sea and air. Park includes amusement rides, coasters, and shows. 707-643-6722

##### Stanford University

*Palm Dr W., Palo Alto.* On the campus' 8,200 acres is an art gallery and an energy research laboratory, both available for tours. 650-723-2300

##### The Cannery

*2801 Leavenworth St.* Built in 1907 as a fruit-canning facility, the building has since been converted into a mall. 415-771-3112

##### University of California

*Oxford St., Berkeley.* The university offers many fine museums, including a botanical garden and a rare book library. 510-642-6000

##### 1849 Monteith House

*518 SW 2nd Ave.* The city's oldest frame building has served as a home, church and store. Open Weds.-Sun., mid June-mid Sept. 800-526-2256 or 541-928-0911

##### Sightseeing Tours

Explore Albany's historic districts and interiors of several historic homes and buildings. Costumed, historic high tea time and dinner theater shows available throughout the year Call for event times and dates. 541-928-0911

##### The Regional Museum

##### Old Aurora Colony Museum

*15018 Second St. NE.* Non-denominational Christians founded this colony in 1856. A log cabin, 1863 home and machine shed all contain artifacts from the colony. Closed Monday - January. 503-678-5754

##### Crater Lake National Park

The caldera of ancient volcanic Mt. Mazama 7,000 years ago created the setting for this beautiful national park. The second-deepest lake in the hemisphere was eventually formed. 541-594-3000

##### Baldwin Hotel Museum

*31 Main St.* Restored 1910 hotel is furnished with original pieces. Open Weds.-Sat. 541-883-4207

##### Favell Museum

*125 W. Main St.* Museum features western and wildlife art. Indian weapons, stone carvings and beadwork. Closed Sun. and Mon. 541-882-9996

#### Salem

##### Antique Powerland

*3995 Brooklake Road NE.* This collection of farm equipment includes horse-drawn vehicles and steam tractors. 503-393-2424
